



## MEDIA RELEASE: WA Universities - December 2025 Offers

13,044 applicants received offers through TISC from WA's five universities on Wednesday 24 December 2025. Offer information is now available to applicants on TISC's website [www.tisc.edu.au](http://www.tisc.edu.au).

People who have been made an offer will receive an email from the university concerned. Applicants who have not received an offer in the December round will be notified by TISC.

The number of applications to TISC from WACE students was higher than last year (12,664 compared to 12,145 last year, an increase of 4.3%). This was due to most Year 12s being required to apply through TISC and a larger population cohort. This year, the number of non-WACE applications through TISC (which includes interstate and mature-age applicants) was 2,766, which is also higher than last year's 2,336, an increase of 18.4%.

93.5% of 2025 WACE students who applied to university received an offer in the December round compared to 94.4% for last year.

Some students who have not yet satisfied the universities' English competence requirements through their WACE results, have been invited to sit a second-chance English test. Students can sit that test on Wednesday 31<sup>st</sup> December 2025 or Saturday 3<sup>rd</sup> January 2026. Results from those sessions are expected to be available on Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> January 2026, in time for the second major offer round. Details on the test are available on the TISC website under 'STAT'.

TISC CEO Andrew Crevald said "It is pleasing to see increasing numbers of WACE students receiving their offer to a WA university, with 2025 numbers being the highest since 2017. Of the 93.5% of WACE applicants who received an offer, around 74% had an offer for their first preference."

Applicants are still able to keep their options open into the January offer round. Students who weren't offered their first preference can use TISC's automatic 'safety net' to reserve their current offer through to the January round, and be considered for a higher preference course if they wish. The 'safety net' is also available to applicants who move their first preference offer further down their preferences in the hope of being offered something different in the January round. These options are explained in detail on the TISC website."

Mr Crevald also offered encouragement to students who did not receive a December offer. "If you know why you didn't get an offer," he said, "and can address those issues satisfactorily, you should receive an offer in the January round. For example, if you still need to satisfy the English competency requirement and will be sitting the second-chance Skills for Tertiary Admissions Test (STAT), that should address English competency for many people."

"But, if you don't know why you didn't get an offer, I recommend getting advice from your preferred universities, or from TISC, so you can establish your options.

"In either case, the universities and TISC have people in their support centres available to help you – see the Contact Us link on the TISC website.

"Applicants can rearrange preferences or add new courses to their preference list from 8.00am on Wednesday 24<sup>th</sup> December to 11.59pm on Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> January 2026. University and TISC contact details and opening hours are available on the TISC website.

"Also, there are still opportunities for anyone who would like to apply for a university place. Most courses are still open and TISC will take applications until 11.59pm Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> January 2026. "
