1 APPLICATION OPENING DATE

Applications through TISC for Semester 1 2027 admission will open on **Tuesday 2 June 2026**.

2 EARLY OFFERS FOR 2027 ADMISSION

Students applying through TISC will automatically be considered for an early offer for their **first preference**, if that course makes early offers. There is no need to complete any separate or additional procedures to be considered for early offers.

The first round of Year 12 Early Offers will be released **September/October 2026** with the final date still to be confirmed. There will be multiple rounds of Early Offers – confirmed dates will be available on the TISC website soon.

3 2027 TISC GUIDE

The *2027 TISC Guide* will be a digital-only publication, in line with most other Australian states. The TISC Guide will be available as a full PDF download (which can be printed as required) and as an embedded flip book on the TISC website. The publication date is yet to be confirmed but is expected to be in mid-July.

4 ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS BROCHURES

The Admission Requirements for School Leavers for 2027 (2026 Year 12) and 2028 (2027 Year 12) are available from the TISC website. The requirements can be found under [Undergraduate>Entry Requirements>School Leavers](#). The brochure for 2029 (2028 Year 12s, to assist 2026 Year 10 students with subject selection) is expected to be available in late May.

Information in these brochures can change, and students, parents and school staff should check for updates when considering subject choice or changes.

5 TISC PRESENTATIONS TO SCHOOLS IN 2026

TISC representatives are available to provide presentations to groups of teachers, career practitioners, Year 12 students and/or parents from now until August. These presentations can be done in person, or online via Microsoft Teams, subject to resourcing and travel time. Please note that bookings may be changed for operational reasons, but TISC would contact you to arrange another suitable time.

Microsoft Bookings will automatically send a confirmation email to the email address used for the booking, one week before the booking date. We ask that you consider either using a general school email address that will be monitored or contacting TISC to update the booking contact details if there is a staff change.

Due to resourcing constraints *TISC can only accommodate one visit per school per year*. If you are looking for more than that, we suggest the following alternatives:

- Two consecutive presentations on the same day may be considered as one booking provided the total booking time is not more than two hours.
- Talk with neighbouring schools to see if you can join forces and arrange joint sessions.

Please note that TISC intends to produce the school presentation in video format this year which can be used in lieu of an in-person presentation.

Presentations to major regional centres (Geraldton, Kalgoorlie, the South West and the Great Southern) are usually arranged in set weeks to enable our presenter to travel. TISC will contact regional schools in these areas to arrange their presentations in accordance with the availability of our presenters. If your school is in one of the above regional areas and you have not received contact regarding a presentation, please contact TISC on 9318 8000 or email schools@tisc.edu.au to book. Online presentations provide flexibility outside those windows.

The PowerPoint presentation available on the TISC website is updated from time to time through the year as new information becomes available.

6 YEAR 12 SUBJECT INCENTIVES UPDATE

TISC is engaged in further consultation on incentives for Year 12 study and we are planning to provide an update by the start of Term 2.

7 PREDICTED ATAR

The ATAR calculator on TISC's website should not be used to predict future ATARs. Adding together four scores based on raw subject scores does not give an accurate TEA and therefore can result in a misleading outcome.

TISC does not endorse any third parties that claim to calculate a predicted ATAR, and caution should be used in procuring any such service.

8 WAUFP EXAMINATIONS 2026 EOI

TISC is seeking Expressions of Interest from teachers who are interested in **setting, checking and/or marking examinations** for the **WAUFP** in **2026**.

TISC administers the **Western Australian Universities' Foundation Program (WAUFP)** for international students for whom English is the second language.

Subjects offered in the program (ATAR Units 3 & 4 unless otherwise stated):

- Accounting and Finance
- Business Management and Enterprise
- Chemistry
- Computer Science
- Economics
- English Language and Australian Cultural Studies (TISC syllabus course – EALD teachers welcome to apply)
- Human Biology
- Mathematics Applications
- Mathematics Methods
- Mathematics Specialist
- Physics
- Psychology

- **Examination Setter** (exams due June/July)
This involves setting an original examination paper to be used in the WAUFP final examinations. The paper would need to be the same level of difficulty as WACE subject examinations and follow the same format. Attention would need to be paid to the language used in the paper due to English being the students' second language. The fee paid for setting a subject examination paper is currently \$3,075.

- **Examination Checker** (exams due June/July)
The Checker would be required to work the paper to ensure that the material examined in the subject examination paper is contained within the syllabus, that marks are allocated appropriately, that grammar and spelling are correct and wording is not ambiguous. The Checker would need to liaise with the Setter to produce the final paper. The fee paid for checking a subject examination paper is currently \$890.

- **Examination Marker** (exam dates early November, marks due 25 November)
Markers are required to mark each examination script according to the supplied Marking Guide. All scripts are marked independently by two markers and the final marks must be reconciled within 5% of each other's marks. The fee paid for marking an examination paper is currently \$19.40 – \$20.95 per script.

Applicants must have appropriate teaching qualifications. Experience in the preparation of subject examination papers at a year 12 level and/or marking ATAR examinations is preferred. Experience with teaching international students may also be an advantage.
